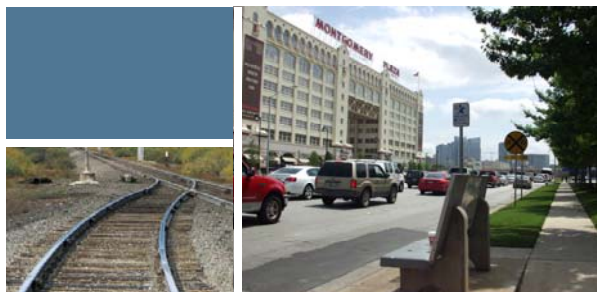


# TRANSPORTATION PUBLIC MEETINGS

## SHORT-TERM PLANNING: Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

## AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY

**Mobility 2030** is the long-range, financially constrained comprehensive plan of transportation projects aimed at meeting mobility needs in North Texas through 2030. To allow ongoing projects and studies to proceed without delay, staff will present final recommendations for the 2009 amendment of Mobility 2030.

**The TIP** is a staged, multi-year listing of transportation projects proposed for funding by federal, state and local sources within the Dallas-Fort Worth metropolitan area. The current TIP contains projects with committed funds in fiscal years 2008 – 2011. The TIP project listing will be modified to be consistent with Mobility 2030 (2009 Amendment), and a new document will be developed for future fiscal years once funding allocations are confirmed.

All transportation projects included in Mobility 2030 and the TIP must meet **air quality conformity**, a federal requirement to ensure funding and approval goes to transportation activities consistent with regional air quality goals. Air quality conformity applies to counties classified by the Environmental Protection Agency as nonattainment for the pollutant ozone: Collin, Dallas, Denton, Ellis, Johnson, Kaufman, Parker, Rockwall and Tarrant counties. Staff will present draft results of the air quality conformity analysis and explain how transportation conformity relates to air quality and the way communities plan and build transportation projects.

## STATUS REPORT: Regional Projects Proposed to Receive Federal Economic Recovery Funds

In response to federal economic recovery initiatives which may include funding for transportation projects, Metropolitan Planning Organizations across the country have been asked to develop lists of transportation projects that are ready for immediate implementation. Staff will present a draft list of high-priority mobility and safety projects in North Texas which could be eligible for economic recovery funds.
