DETERMINING THE FUTURE OF TRANSPORTATION IN THE REGION

NCTCOG is embarking on development of the next metropolitan transportation plan, Mobility 2035, a comprehensive plan that will outline how transportation needs through the next 25 years will be addressed. Transportation-related ideas and opinions from residents in the 12-county metropolitan area are especially important at this early stage in plan development. Residents are invited to help establish a vision for the future of transportation in the region.

During interactive workshops, participants will discuss:

- Future transportation needs.
- Future transportation funding scenarios and options.
- The relationship between population growth and transportation.
- The relationship between transportation and the environment.
- Priorities for the future transportation plan.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN

The NCTCOG Transportation Department seeks to inform North Texans about transportation and air quality projects and planning and involve them in the decision-making. The Public Participation Plan outlines how an open exchange of ideas and information is encouraged. The Public Participation Plan is occasionally updated to ensure it includes adequate opportunities for sharing information with and seeking involvement from all individuals. A summary of proposed changes will be presented. The proposed revisions address the growing region, changing communications and suggestions received at previous public meetings.

STATUS REPORT: LOCAL, STATE & FEDERAL FUNDING FOR TRANSPORTATION

A comprehensive list of funded transportation projects is maintained in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Projects with committed funds from federal, state and local sources are included in the TIP. To maintain an accurate project listing, this document is updated on a regular basis. In addition to presenting proposed quarterly modifications to the TIP, staff will provide an update on economic recovery projects with funding allocated from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

STATUS REPORT: FUNDING CRISIS

Staff will provide an update on efforts to secure desperately needed funding for transportation projects. Additionally, various potential revenue scenarios and the impact of transportation funding on the region will be presented.
